### **CURRICULUM AND PLANNING, 2016/17**

### Karla Graessley, Director of Elementary Education/Office of Student Affairs (OSA)

- Presented on current status of District Turnaround Network (DTN), closing in on launch items.
   The catalyzing event takes place on Welcome Day, August 29th.
- 2016/17 will work on systems for Phase I and bringing to scale by building, via principals.
- DTN systems will standardize data collection, assessment, actions and language.
- Dr. Edmondson talks about launching the DTN, aligning with the Board goals and reporting of
  information to the Board of Education (BOE). Having a BOE representative is helpful to
  understanding the urgency and critical work, with clear understanding of delivery of message
  from OSA to BOE.

## Laura Frey-Greathouse, Director of Students and Staffing/Office of Student Affairs

Part of DTN Phase 1

- What resources will staff receive? Tier 1:
  - Climate and culture
  - Looking at Conscious Discipline, reactions to situations and self-regulation for students and adults
  - Structures and routines
- Tier 2:
  - Restorative Practices
  - Cultural Proficiency monthly meetings with Dr. Shayla Griffin
- Tier 3: Targeted Support
  - Social work support in every building
  - o UM Depression Center
  - Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)
- Intense student support is fully non-academic
- Looking at MTSS tiers, we need referrals to enter into the process tier
- Title 1 and 31A budgets reflect MTSS tiers, social emotional or academic needs being met
- Guaranteed curriculum: how it's organized, plans by school, coaches to help drive practices

### **Building Presentations**

- Scott Snyder and Cory Gildersleeve academic scheduling and programming at Ypsilanti
   Community High School
  - One word to describe vision:
    - Collaborate. A singular focus of staff collaborating to evaluate our impact on learning.
  - o Describe STEMM and New Tech programs
    - STEMM will function on A/B block schedule. Students can finish their requirements in 3 years and obtain a certificate or associate degree
    - New Tech will share the same floor, laboratories
      - Project-based learning
      - 1-1 learning (laptop)
      - Using Echo program (online) and integrated course (two courses together, this year will be City Stats, economics and gov't, civics and statistics)
    - Both programs are promoted by SLC leaders, Scott Heister and Trish Thomas. All SLCs have common planning and professional development time.
  - o What is the plan for program implementation with reduced staff?
    - Freshman House
    - 8 periods with 6 core and 2 unified arts (with Read 180, Math 180)
    - Senior Project now tied to 12th grade ELA class completed by Spring Break
  - o Choir, band and art programs?
    - Emphasis for growing arts: Art includes drawing, ceramics. Band includes Freshman (18 week course), Exploratory, Symphony, Choir.
  - o Plan for increased achievement?
    - Honors ELA, math, social studies
    - Repeaters, financial literacy, advisory skills
    - Looking at stop gaps for lack of physics instruction
    - District plans for New Tech families and understanding of the program's continuation, supporting changes within STEMM's SLC leader
  - o Mechanisms to ensure credits and proficiency?
    - Credit goes to support staff, counselors for generating student information and credits earned. They have been sorted and reverse order by age and credits and parents will be contacted by Jonathan Royce as ACCE candidates or support program. Repeater classes will be run as academic probation and parents must sign a compact.

### Jonathan Royce, Principal at ACCE

- One word to describe vision:
  - Community. Students need to feel safe. Give them a home and the education piece they need.
  - Most students are in tier 3 and will need supports, remediation, credits or behavior wise. 60 targeted students running on the same high school program. After school program will start afterward for credit recovery.
- Program and achievement goals
  - o 4 day academic Monday through Thursday, Friday will be out in the community
    - Partnerships with Holmes School, pilot program for reading and peer mentorship
    - Community organizations to partner with, internships
    - Increase attendance, course completion, building strong connections through community

- o Interaction with high school
  - Athletics are available
- Interaction with community
  - Partnerships, picnics
  - AATA will provide transportation less some WCC runs via traditional transportation. Families have a mandatory meeting at ACCE on Aug. 24th, where cards will be distributed, practice rides will be encouraged, bus cards can be used month long, every 30 minutes a route is available.

### **Bob Wellman, Director of Athletics**

- One word to describe vision:
  - Opportunity. We are giving students an opportunity to interact with peers, adults, life lessons. Opportunities for respect, interact with different students and environments.
- What sports are we offering?
  - Fall: Varsity/JV football (hope for Freshman football), Freshman/JV volleyball, soccer, cheerleading, boys' and girls' cross country
  - Winter: basketball (all levels), girls basketball (all levels), wrestling, sideline cheer, Varsity boys' swimming, boys' and girls' bowling
  - Spring: baseball, softball, boys' Varsity golf
    - Possible partnership with Polo Fields
    - Improvement of personal records in swimming
    - Hoping to add girls' golf
    - Little interest in lacrosse (only 6 signed up last year)
  - o Middle School: 7th, 8th grade football, cheer, boys' and girls' basketball, wrestling, track
- What academic supports are in place for students?
  - Bright Futures
  - When students become ineligible, they will carry a travel card
  - Athletic GPA last year was 2.75, overall was below 2.0 indicating student athletes do better than the general population
  - Students must pass 66% of their course load to be athletics eligible. Grade checks start
    week 2 of school. If a student fails a class, coaches are notified, tutors are put into place.
    Hoping to implement 2.0 minimum later on, but concerns about losing athlete numbers.
    Most districts follow 66% passing guidelines.
- What fundraisers have been put into place?
  - Coach Jackson's presence has brought Kirk Profit and Tom Biggs, bringing donations to the football program. Bill Martin, former UM Athletic Director, gave a donation specifically used for uniforms and pads, videos, improve weight room and helping all athletes.
- Upcoming
  - Wellman will provide a weekly written brief with an overview of what's happening in the district and what's upcoming.

### Aaron Rose, Principal of Ypsilanti Community Middle School

- Fiscally responsible and honoring the work of professional staff
- One word to describe vision:
  - Exploration to try new things in core, extracurricular
  - Vision every student will be connected to YCMS through academics, clubs, athletics, mentorships, intentional connections with our students
  - Responsive of students' emotional and academic needs, teachers' needs in Turnaround work for professional growth

- Community a safe, orderly place to receive education
- Master schedule
  - Able to fit lots of pieces into the schedule while maintaining fiscally responsible structure
  - Target purposeful, exploratory learning
  - 7th grade: STEMM8th grade: ACTech
- Through partnership with high school, immersion into culture building activities
- Developmental and grade appropriate environments will assist with learning
- Co-curricular classes: support work in SLC classes
- Building relationships within their house and recognizing cohorts of students who need more supports
- Planning within SLCs: teachers have 90 minute uninterrupted time to work on DTN, planning, etc.
- 6th grade: Target instructional support in Freshman academy: where promotion policy work will be designed. If students are retained, program must be different by design. If student is immersed in at-risk support, non negotiable supports for literacy and numeracy without grade level barriers.
- 7th grade: UM partnership, Pathways to Peace, staff culture planning, Conscious Discipline,
   Teaching with Poverty in Mind

### Raymond Alvarado, Principal at Estabrook Learning Community

- One word to describe vision:
  - Readiness
  - 72% retention of 8th graders going to YCHS, others going to Belleville, Lincoln, Ann Arbor, moved away
  - o Gender based classrooms: boys are 15% lower than girls in academics
  - Almost at capacity at Estabrook, close to 30 per classroom with exception of grades 3, 4,
  - Offering leadership class for older kids to offer leadership to younger kids
    - 5 areas of focus: Character building, career awareness, test readiness, informational text, leadership (time when they are assigned to younger students, mentoring younger students)
  - Upcoming survey of families regarding move to YCMS before end of year

### Cassandra Sheriff, Principal of Ypsilanti International Elementary School

- One word to describe vision:
  - Purpose. The reason for which something is done, created or why it exists. We educate
    the whole child and every child receives academic success.
- Working with PYP certified instructor/coordinator, Jean Ramsayer
  - Will continue to work with Cassandra and staff to provide curriculum structure, taught lessons, mentor is vital in IB success (per Nhu Do and Jessica Garcia's advice)
  - Collaboration and team building, staff attended making the PYP happen
  - Jean will lead training the week of August 22-26 in classroom instruction and core curriculum requirements applied to IB framework
  - All staff will participate in training in November, Making PYP Happen in the Classroom
  - All staff at all grade levels will be trained in curriculum assessment, plan and coordinate for IB requirement framework, with continued collaboration with WIMA and WIHI
  - Beautification of the building, tour the building and meet teachers
  - Enrollment and class size represents diversity in race, gender

- Pre k (age 3): full at 16
- Pre k (age 4): full at 16
- Kindergarten: full at 50 (waitlist 4)
- 1st grade: lowest enrollment
- 2nd grade: 55/60
- Communications
  - Principals have been sent where Adams families were assigned, working together to work out enrollment transfers

### Approval of Ann Arbor Public Schools Rental of YCS Facility

Amended: "...move that the Board of Education *authorize* the Superintendent to negotiate terms of Ann Arbor Public Schools' rental of West Middle School for Allen Elementary students for a period of at least four months."

Discussion: West Middle School has passed inspections and is ready to go, pending a few requests and appropriate rental amount from Superintendent Swift. With the assistance (or "brokering") of WISD, the building will be made available pending BOE approval. Allen students currently use 29 classrooms (including extracurricular classes).

Trustee Meadows has concerns about open enrollment and ability to pull Ypsilanti district students. Dr. Swift confirmed enrollment was closed this morning for school-of-choice students. Allen has 415 students, but West will not be approved for pre-school students so those students will attend an alternative site.

Vice President Hawkins asked about how long the process would take to move Allen students into the building. Steve Burgess stated the school is move-in ready.

Superintendent Swift does not know the duration of rental but it will likely be months, not weeks. When Allen's renovation is complete, the plan is to move back to their school.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member Ellen Champagne

and supported by Member Brenda Megdows

WHEREAS, the District has received an offer from Hope Community Church (the "Purchaser") to purchase real property owned by the District located at 2100 Ellsworth Road within the Township of Ypsilanti, Washtenaw County, Michigan (the "Property"), which Property is more fully described in the Offer to Purchase Real Estate and Addendum to Purchase Agreement (collectively, the "Purchase Agreement" and "Addendum"), copies of which are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Attachments "1" and "2"; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the Property is no longer necessary for school purposes and that it would be in the best interests of the District to sell the Property to the Purchaser upon the terms and conditions contained in the Purchase Agreement and Addendum; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to authorize and direct Dr. Benjamin Edmondson, the Superintendent of Schools, or his designee, to execute the Purchase Agreement and Addendum substantially in the form as Attachments "1" and "2," to make any revisions to the Purchase Agreement and Addendum not inconsistent with this resolution, and to take any other action to sell the Property, subject to review and approval by the District's legal counsel.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Board hereby authorizes the sale of the Property to the Purchaser.

Dear Dr. Edmondson:

Thank you for all your hard work on the resolution, purchase agreement, and addendum. I am glad we are so close to the finish line. I am returning to you the purchase agreement and addendum.

The purchase agreement remains intact, though there are some corrections that I have noted and initialed on the document. First, the legal description of the property was inaccurate; I contacted the Ypsilanti Township assessor and got the proper legal description. I learned from the assessor that the Ardis School property sits on two parcels, each with its own parcel ID number. The corrected legal description has now been placed in the addendum. Second, regarding the purchase agreement, we have revised the amount of our down payment. This was done in consultation with our lender, Union Bank. Finally, I corrected a line that refers to the addendum, noting the date that the addendum has been revised. I initialed each of these corrections, and our realtor requests that you would also initial the changes, initial each page, and sign the purchase agreement.

Regarding the addendum, last Friday I sent it to our attorney for her review. As I understand it, she worked on the document so that it would conform to standard practice for commercial real estate transactions. It begins with the corrected property description and ends with an entirely new date and signature. A significant feature of this addendum is an offer from our church allowing the school district to lease the culinary arts wing of the building from us, rent-free, for a period of four years. Our attorney says that this lease agreement--regarding utilities, insurance and the like--should be our next focus and should be finalized before the closing. Our attorney is Teressa Streng of the law firm Kaiser Streng, PLLC. Mrs. Streng says she is quite willing to address any questions you may have. As with the purchase agreement, our realtor requests that you initial each page and sign the document.

I look forward to seeing you at the Monday school board meeting. Our church looks forward to many years of good collaboration with the Ypsilanti Community Schools. - 2. In the Bond Resolution, the Issuer authorized the Superintendent of Schools to accept the offer of Fifth Third Securities, Inc., East Lansing, Michigan (the "Underwriter"), within the parameters set forth in such resolution; and
- 3. Based upon information provided by the Issuer's financial consulting firm and the Underwriter, the Issuer selected a negotiated sale to allow for flexibility in the timing, sale and structure of the Bonds in response to changing market conditions and to accomplish the refunding of the Refunded Obligations; and
- 4. The Underwriter presented an offer to purchase the Bonds to the Superintendent on August 31, 2016, which the Superintendent accepted pursuant to the authority delegated in the Bond Resolution.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The offer of the Underwriter as set forth in the bond purchase agreement (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"), and the terms and conditions set forth therein, presented to the Superintendent on August 31, 2016, to purchase the Bonds in the principal amount of \$32,965,000 at a purchase price of \$32,871,049.75, which is the par value of the Bonds, less the Underwriter's discount of \$93,950.25, is hereby ratified and affirmed. The Bonds shall be issued on behalf of the Former School District in the aggregate principal sum of \$32,965,000 and designated 2016 Refunding Bonds, Series C (General Obligation Unlimited Tax) (Federally Taxable). The Underwriter has agreed in the Bond Purchase Agreement that it shall initially offer the Bonds to the public at the yields set forth in Exhibit A hereto.
- 2. The Bonds shall be dated September 27, 2016, and shall mature on May 1 of the years 2019 to 2023, inclusive, on which interest is payable commencing May 1, 2017 and semi-annually thereafter on November 1 and May 1, at the rates and in the principal amounts set forth in

Exhibit A. The Bonds shall be initially offered to the public at the initial offering yields as set forth in Exhibit A hereto.

- 3. Bonds of this issue are not subject to redemption prior to maturity.
- 4. Blank Bonds with the manual or facsimile signatures of the President and Secretary of the Board affixed thereto, shall, upon issuance and delivery and from time to time thereafter as necessary, be delivered to the Paying Agent for safekeeping to be used for registration and transfer of ownership.

The Bonds are registered as to principal and interest and are transferable as provided in the Bond Resolution only upon the books of the Issuer kept for that purpose by the Paying Agent, by the registered owner thereof in person or by an agent of the owner duly authorized in writing, upon the surrender of the Bond together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Paying Agent duly executed by the registered owner or agent thereof and thereupon a new Bond or Bonds in the same aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity shall be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor as provided in the Bond Resolution, and upon payment of the charges, if any, therein provided. The Bonds are issuable in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the aggregate principal amount for each maturity.

If any Bond shall become mutilated, the Issuer, at the expense of the holder of the Bonds, shall furnish or cause to be furnished, and the Paying Agent shall authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor in exchange and substitution of the mutilated Bond, upon surrender to the Paying Agent of the mutilated Bond. If any Bond issued under this resolution shall be lost, destroyed or stolen, evidence of the loss, destruction or theft and indemnity may be submitted to the Paying Agent, and if satisfactory to the Paying Agent and the Issuer, the Issuer at the expense of the owner, shall furnish or cause to be furnished, and the Paying Agent shall authenticate and deliver a new Bond of like tenor and bearing the statement required by Act 354, Public Acts of Michigan, 1972, as amended, being sections 129.131 to 129.134, inclusive, of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or any applicable law hereafter enacted, in lieu of and in substitution of the Bond so lost, destroyed or stolen. If any such Bond shall have matured or shall be about to mature, instead of issuing a substitute Bond, the Paying Agent may pay the same without surrender thereof.

- 5. Upon delivery of the Bonds, the accrued interest, if any, shall be deposited in the Debt Retirement Fund for the Bonds and the balance of the Bond proceeds shall be used as follows:
- A. The approximate sum of \$32,735,350.76 shall be paid to the Michigan Department of Treasury for payment of the Refunded Obligations.
- B. The approximate sum of \$135,698.99 shall be used to pay the cost of issuance of the Bonds, and any balance remaining from that sum shall be deposited in the Debt Retirement Fund for the Bonds.
- 6. The President and Secretary are hereby authorized to provide the Bonds in conformity with the specifications of this resolution by causing their manual or facsimile signatures to be affixed thereto, and upon the manual execution by the authorized signatory of the Paying Agent, the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to cause said Bonds to be delivered to the Underwriter upon receipt of the purchase price and accrued interest, if any.
- 7. The Preliminary Official Statement, dated August 24, 2016, as amended by an addendum dated August 26, 2016, is deemed final for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), relating to the Bonds and its use and distribution by the Underwriter is hereby authorized, approved and confirmed.

- 8. The Superintendent is authorized and directed to execute and deliver the final Official Statement on behalf of the Issuer. The Superintendent is further authorized to approve, execute and deliver any amendments and supplements to the final Official Statement necessary to assure that the statements therein are true, as of the time the Bonds are delivered to the Underwriter, and that it does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact and does not omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading. In the absence of the Superintendent, the President may execute the above documents.
- 9. The President or Vice President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, the Superintendent, and/or all other officers, agents and representatives of the Issuer and each of them shall, on behalf of the Former School District, execute, issue and deliver any certificates, statements, warranties, representations, or documents necessary to effect the purposes of this resolution, the Bonds or the Bond Purchase Agreement.
- 10. The officers, agents and employees of the Issuer are authorized to take all other actions necessary and convenient to facilitate sale and delivery of the Bonds on behalf of the Former School District.
- 11. The Issuer hereby appoints U.S. Bank National Association, Detroit, Michigan, as Paying Agent-Bond Registrar and directs the Superintendent of Schools to execute for and on behalf of the Issuer a Paying Agent-Bond Registrar Agreement.
- 12. The debt levy heretofore certified for the 2016 tax year is hereby reallocated for the July 2016 levy as shown on the attached Exhibit B.
- 13. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are hereby rescinded.

#### YPSILANTI COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT CONTRACTED SERVICE AGREEMENT

This agreement is made this second day of August, 2016, between Pediatric Therapy Associates, LLC, P.O. Box 8355, Ann Arbor, Michigan, 48107, whose tax identification number is 38-260-4341, hereafter referred to a Contractor, and the Ypsilanti Community Schools, hereafter referred to as School District.

It is the intention of the parties to enter into an Agreement defining the nature and extent of the duties to be performed by the Contractor, the place the services are to be performed, the amount of time for the performance of the duties and the responsibilities of the school district.

#### SECTION I

- 1) The Contractor shall commence performance of the duties no earlier than August 8, 2016. The duration for providing services shall be through August 10, 2017.
- 2) The Contractor agrees to perform the following duties and any necessary tasks incident to full performance of the described duties.
- A. Provide direct therapy services, as designated by the IEP or IFSP, to students enrolled in School District programs who are assigned to the Contractor by the School District.
- B. Provide training and consultation to School District staff, as directed by the Director of Special Education.
  - C. Provide evaluations as needed, and requested by the School District.
  - D. Attend IEPC and IFSP meetings and team meetings as appropriate.
  - E. Maintain written records required by the School District.
  - F. Provide ongoing communication with appropriate school personnel, parents, other professionals associated with the students' therapy programming.
- 3) The Contractor agrees to perform and shall provide, at the request of the School District, periodic reports describing services the Contractor is providing.
- 4) The Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice describing the services for part payment of the contract price not more frequently than once per month.
- 5) In the event that the Contractor uses motor vehicles in the course of performing the services described above, the Contractor will provide proof of public liability insurance upon request.
- 6) The Contractor understands that the School District liability insurance does not afford any coverage to the Contractor for any work associated with this contract. The Contractor agrees to hold harmless the School District for any sum related to the cost of liability insurance and any associated attorney fees arriving out of the performance described above. The School District shall request the Contractor provide proof of professional

liability insurance.

- 7) The Contractor acknowledges by her signature that she has read the Agreement and understands same and agrees this contract constitutes the total agreement between the parties and that anything not included in this contract is expressly excluded.
- 8) The Contractor will hold a current license in the state of Michigan and will furnish a copy upon request.

#### SECTION II

The School District agrees as follows:

- 1) The Contractor's services are based on the time reasonably expended by the Contractor to complete the tasks described and is based on a rate of \$56.00 per hour of time expended for Speech, Physical and Occupational Therapy services, not to exceed \$355,348.00.
- 2) The Contractor agrees that the relationship with the School District shall during the life of this Agreement be that of an independent contractor. As such, the School District agrees that the Contractor shall be free to dispose of such portion of his entire time, energy, skill during the time he is not obligated to devote to the School District in such manner as the Contractor sees fit and to such persons, firms or corporations as the Contractor deems advisable. The Contractor shall not be considered as having an employee status or as being entitled to participate in any plans, arrangements, or distributions by the school district pertaining to or in connection with any fringe, pension, bonus or similar benefits for the School Districts regular employees. The School District will not withhold or pay any sums, state, federal or local taxes, FICA, Michigan School Employees Retirement, insurance, or workman's compensation insurance. The Contractor agrees to hold the School District harmless for the payment of such sum, interest, penalties or costs in the collection of the same.
- 3) The School District acknowledges that the Contractor has no responsibility for the supervision of any personnel in caring out their educational functions, and any recommendations made by the Contractor, other than those related to a student's therapy performance, will require the consideration of the School District.
- 4) The School District agrees that the Contractor shall have access to the School District premises at such times as is necessary for the Contractor to perform the above prescribed tasks. The location in which the services are provided will be mutually agreed upon by the Contractor and the School District as to best serve the student's needs. Time required for travel between sites within a district will be billed at the hourly rate.
- 5) The School District agrees that the Contractor shall have access to records related to students assigned to them.

- 6) The School District agrees to purchase evaluation and treatment material necessary for provision of the therapy services.
- 7) The School District agrees to pay the invoices submitted by the Contractor within thirty calendar days from receipt in the School District's Business Office.

#### Election/Appointment

#### 0142.1 Electoral Process

The number of members of the Board shall remain the same as before July 1, 1996 unless changed by the School electors at a regular or special School election. A ballot question for changing the number of Board members may be placed on the ballot by action of the Board or by petition submitted by School electors as provided under Michigan election law (M.C.L. 168.301 to 168.315).

Members of the Board shall be elected in the November even year general election (the first Tuesday after the first Monday) in a manner that is consistent with State law.

A special election may be called by the Board as provided under Michigan election law (M.C.L. 168.301 to 168.315).

#### 0142.2 Qualifications

An individual is eligible for election as a School Board member if the individual is a citizen of the United States and is a qualified and registered elector of the School District by the filing deadline.

M.C.L. 168.302

#### 0142.3 Term

Members of the Board shall be elected by the School electors for terms of () four (4) years or (x) six (6) years.

At each regular School election, members of the Board shall be elected to fill the positions of those whose terms will expire. A term of office begins as provided by law (M.C.L. 168.302) and continues until a successor is elected and qualified.

SCHOOL DISTRICT

At least one (1) School Board member for a School District shall be elected at each of the School District's regular elections. A School Board member's term of office begins January 1st, immediately following the November election.

#### 0142.4 Oath

Each newly-elected Board member shall file an acceptance of office as well as an affidavit of eligibility within ten (10) days after receiving a certificate of election and shall take an oath of office as prescribed by the Constitution of Michigan.

#### 0142.5 Vacancies

The office of a Board member shall become vacant immediately upon the occurrence of any one (1) of the following events:

- A. the death of the incumbent, or the incumbent's being adjudicated insane or being found to be mentally incompetent by the proper court
- B. the incumbent's resignation
- C. the incumbent's removal from office
- D. the incumbent's conviction of a felony
- E. the incumbent's election or appointment being declared void by a competent tribunal
- F. the incumbent's neglect or failure to file the acceptance of office, to take the oath of office, or to give or renew an official bond required by law
- G. the failure of the District to elect a successor at the annual school meeting or election
- H. the incumbent's ceasing to possess the legal qualifications for holding office
- I. the incumbent's residence being removed from the School District

If less than a majority of the offices of the District becomes vacant, the remaining members of the Board shall fill the vacancy immediately.

If the vacancy is not filled within thirty (30) days after it occurs, the Board of the Intermediate School District shall fill the vacancy by appointment.

A person elected or appointed to fill a vacancy on the Board shall file an acceptance of office and shall hold office until the next regular school election.

#### Filling a Board Vacancy

If the majority of the Board is still seated, the vacancy shall be filled by the Board using the following procedure:

- The Board shall seek qualified and interested candidates from the community through the news media, word of mouth, and contacts with appropriate organizations.
- All applicants are to submit a notice of their interest, in writing, to the Superintendent
- () The Board shall interview all interested candidates to ascertain their qualifications.
- Appointment by the Board to fill a vacancy shall be by majority vote of the full Board.

#### 0142.6 Recall

Any member of the Board may be recalled pursuant to  $M.C.L.\ 168.951$  et seq.

#### 0142.7 Orientation

The Board believes that the preparation of each Board member for the performance of Board duties is essential to the effective functioning of the Board. The Board shall encourage each new Board member to understand the functions of the Board, acquire knowledge of matters related to the operation of the District, and learn Board procedures. Accordingly, the Board shall give to each new Board member

#### 0143 Authority

Individual members of the Board do not possess the powers that reside in the Board of Education. The Board speaks through its minutes and not through its individual members. An act of the Board shall not be valid unless approved at an official meeting by at least a majority vote of the members elected to and serving on the Board. M.C.L. 380.1201



No member of the Board shall be denied documents or information to which s/he is legally entitled and which are required in the performance of his/her duties as a Board member.

Access to District personnel records shall be subject to the following rules:

- A. Examination of school employee personnel records by the Board of Education shall be conducted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act.
- B. Personnel records shall, in their entirety, be returned to the custody of the Superintendent at the conclusion of the Board meeting.
- C. Information obtained from employee personnel records by members of the Board shall be used only for the purpose of aiding the members in fulfilling their legal responsibilities in making decisions in such matters as appointments, assignments, promotions, demotions, remuneration, discipline, and dismissal or to aid the development and implementation of personnel policies, or for such other uses as are necessary to enable the Board to carry out its legal responsibilities.

#### 0143.1 Public Expression of Board Members

The Board President functions as the official spokesperson for the Board.

From time-to-time, however, individual Board members make public statements on school matters:

- A. to local media;
- B. to local officials and/or State officials.

Sometimes the statements imply, or the readers (listeners) infer, that the opinions expressed or statements made are the official positions of the Board. The misunderstandings that can result from these incidents can embarrass both the member and the Board. Therefore, Board members should, when writing or speaking on school matters to the media, legislators, and other officials, make it clear that their views do not necessarily reflect the views of the Board or of their colleagues on the Board.

- A. This bylaw shall apply to all statements and/or writings by individual Board members not explicitly sanctioned by a majority of its members, except as follows:
  - 1. correspondence, such as legislative proposals, when the Board member has received official guidance from the Board on the matters discussed in the letter
  - 2. routine, not for publication, correspondence of the Superintendent and other Board employees
  - 3. routine "thank you" letters of the Board
  - 4. statements by Board members on nonschool matters (providing the statements do not identify the author as a member of the Board)
  - 5. personal statements not intended for publication

B. Copies of this bylaw shall be sent annually to local media by the Board President.

#### 0144 Operations

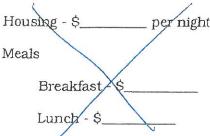
#### 0144.1 Compensation

Board members shall receive not more than \$30 per meeting up to a total of not more than fifty-two (52) meetings (including committee meetings) as compensation for their services. Expenses of a Board member shall be reimbursed when incurred in the performance of his/her duties or in the performance of functions authorized by the Board and duly vouchered.

M.C.L. 380.11a, 380.1254

The following guidelines have been established by the Board of Education to ensure appropriate and proper reimbursement of expenses for Board members.

- Expenses will be reimbursed only for activities authorized by the Board.
- Reimbursement for mileage will not exceed the current rate established by the Internal Revenue Service.
- Attendance at Board-approved conferences should be at the location closest to the District.
- When attending a Board-approved conference, all fees, parking, mileage, meals, and housing will be reimbursed. The maximum reimbursable expenses are as follows:

Telephone expenses will be reimbursed to a maximum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ per fiscal year.

- Purchase of any printed or other materials relating to Boardmanship will be reimbursed if prepurchase approval is given by the Board. If such approval is not possible or feasible, a voucher must be submitted to the Board for approval. No postpurchase voucher will be approved if it exceeds \$\_\_\_\_\_\_.
- When the Board attends a community or school-related event as a Board function, or a Board member attends as the designated representative of the Board, any incurred expenses, including mileage, will be reimbursed by the Board. If a Board member attends such events as a private citizen, any incurred expenses are to be paid by the Board member.



No entertainment expenses or purchases of alcoholic beverages are reimbursable.

A voucher detailing the amount and nature of each expense must be submitted to the Board for approval at a Board meeting after the expenses have been incurred and prior to reimbursement.

Board members may use District credit or debit cards only in accordance with Board Policy 6423 and the accompanying administrative guidelines.

#### 0144.2 Board Member Ethics

As members of the Board of Education, Board members will strive to improve public education and to that end they will:

- A. attend all regularly scheduled Board meetings insofar as possible, and become informed concerning the issues to be considered at those meetings;
- B. recognize that they should endeavor to make policy decisions only after full discussion at publicly held Board meetings;

- C. render all decisions based on the available facts and independent judgment, and refuse to surrender that judgment to individuals or special interest groups;
- D. encourage the free expression of opinion by all Board members, and seek systematic communications between the Board and students, staff, and all elements of the community;
- E. work with the other Board members to establish effective Board policies and to delegate authority for the administration of the District to the Superintendent;
- F. communicate to other Board members and the Superintendent expressions of public reaction to Board policies and school programs;
- G. inform themselves about current educational issues by individual study and through participation in programs providing needed information, such as those sponsored by the State and National School Boards Associations;
- H. support the employment of those persons best qualified to serve as school staff, and insist on a regular and impartial evaluation of all staff;
- I. avoid being placed in a position of conflict of interest, and refrain from using their Board positions for personal partisan gain;
- J. take no private action that will compromise the Board or administration, and respect the confidentiality of information that is privileged under applicable law:
- K. remember always that their first and greatest concern must be for the educational welfare of the students attending the public schools.

#### REVISED BYLAW 0144.3 - VOL. 30, NO. 1

#### 0144.3 Conflict of Interest

Board members shall perform their official duties in a manner free from conflict of interest. To this end:

- A. No Board member shall use his/her position as a Board member to benefit either himself/herself or any other individual or agency apart from the total interest of the School District.
- B. When a member of the Board determines that the possibility of a personal interest conflict exists, s/he should, prior to the matter being considered, disclose his/her interest (such disclosure shall become a matter of record in the minutes of the Board), and thereafter shall abstain from participation in both the discussion of the matter and the vote thereon.
- C. A member of the Board is presumed to have a conflict of interest if the member or his/her family member has a financial interest, or a competing financial interest, in the contract or other financial transaction or is an employee of the School District.

Having a child in the District does not alone constitute a conflict of interest or financial interest in a contract or other financial transaction of the School District.

"Family member" means a person's spouse or spouse's sibling or child; a person's sibling or sibling's spouse or child; a person's child or child's spouse; or a person's parent or parent's spouse, and includes these relationships as created by adoption or marriage.

- 1. A Board member is not considered to have a financial interest in any of the following instances:
  - a. A contract or other financial transaction between the School District and any of the following:
    - 1) A corporation in which the individual is a stockholder owning 1% or less of the total stock outstanding in any class if the stock is not listed on a stock exchange or owning stock that has a present market value of \$25,000.00 or less if the stock is listed on a stock exchange.
    - A corporation in which a trust, if the individual is a beneficiary under the trust, owns 1% or less of the total stock outstanding in any class if the stock is not listed on a stock exchange or owns stock that has a present market value of \$25,000.00 or less if the stock is listed on a stock exchange.
    - 3) A professional limited liability company organized pursuant to the Michigan limited liability company act, if the individual is an employee but not a member of the company.

- b. A contract or other financial transaction between the School District and any of the following:
  - 1) A corporation in which the individual is not a director, officer, or employee.
  - 2) A firm, partnership, or other unincorporated association, in which the individual is not a partner, member, or employee.
  - 3) A corporation or firm that has an indebtedness owed to the individual.
- c. A contract between the School District and the intermediate school district.
- d. A contract awarded to the lowest qualified bidder, upon receipt of sealed bids pursuant to a published notice for bids if the notice does not bar, except as authorized by law, any qualified person, firm, corporation, or trust from bidding. This does not apply to any amendments or renegotiations of a contract or to additional payments under the contract that were not authorized by the contract at the time of award.

- 2. If the financial interest pertains to a proposed contract with the District, the following requirements must be met:
  - a. The Board member shall disclose the financial interest in the contract to the Board with such disclosure made a part of the official Board minutes. If his/her direct financial interest amounts to \$250 or more or five percent (5%) or more of the contract cost to the District, the Board member shall make the disclosure in one of two (2) ways:
    - In writing, to the Board president (or if the member is the Board president, to the Board secretary) at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which the vote on the contract will be taken. The disclosure shall be made public in the same manner as the Board's notices of its public meetings. (See Bylaw 0165.)
    - 2) By announcement at a meeting at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which a vote on the contract is to be taken. The Board member must use this method of disclosure if his/her financial interest amounts to \$5000 or more.

b. Any contract in which there is a conflict of interest as defined by this bylaw and the related statute (M.C.L. 380.1203) must be approved by a majority vote of the full Board without the vote of any Board member with a financial interest.

However, if a majority of the members of the Board are required to abstain from voting on a contract or other financial transaction due to a financial interest, then for the purposes of that contract or other financial transaction, the members who are not required to abstain constitute a quorum of the board and only a majority of those members eligible to vote is required for approval of the contract or financial transaction.

- c. The official minutes of the Board disclose the name of each party involved in the contract, the nature of the financial interest, and the terms of the contract including the duration, financial consideration between the parties, facilities or services of the District included in the contract, and the nature and degree of assignment of District staff needed to fulfill the contract.
- d. A Board member with a conflict of interest in a contract may not participate in the discussion of nor vote on the contract.

- Epard members shall not accept any money, goods, or services with a value in excess of the amount established annually by the State Department of Education (\$44 within any one (1) month period as of December 31, 2004) from any person who does business or seeks to do business of any kind with the District. Board members shall not solicit or accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts involved with Federal grant funds
  - () except that a Board member may accept an unsolicited gift of nominal value. For purposes of this section, "nominal value" means that the gift has a monetary value of \$ or less. PICK ONE OF THE TWO SUB-OPTIONS

A Board member may be appointed to serve as a volunteer coach or supervisor of a student extra-curricular activity if all of the following conditions are present:

- 1. the Board member receives no compensation for service as a volunteer coach or supervisor:
- the Board member abstains from voting on issues before the Board concerning the program during the period of time s/he serves as a volunteer coach or supervisor;

- 3. there is no other qualified applicant available to fill a vacant position; and
- 4. the appointing authority has received the results of a criminal history check and criminal records check from the Michigan State Police or the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the Board member.

#### 0144.4 Indemnification

The Board may hold harmless, indemnify, pay, settle, or compromise a judgment against a Board member to the extent allowed under the law.

#### 0145

#### Discriminatory Harassment

The Board of Education's intent is to provide an environment that fosters the respect and dignity of each person. To this end, the Board is committed to maintaining an environment free of harassment and intimidation.

Sexual harassment includes all unwelcorne sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and verbal or physical contacts of a sexual nature whenever submission to such conduct is made a condition of employment or a basis for an employment decision. Other prohibited conduct includes that which has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, discriminatory, or offensive environment on the basis of gender, religion, race, color, national origin or ancestry, age, disability, height, weight, marital status, and/or any other legally protected characteristic.

Sexual orientation, prevenues gender identity.

The harassment of a student, staff member, or third party (e.g. visiting speaker, athletic team member, volunteer, parent, etc.) is strictly forbidden. Any person who is found to have violated this policy will be subject to discipline in accordance with law.

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#### DUTIES

0171 Officers

#### 0171.1 President

The President of the Board of Education shall:

- preside at meetings of the Board;
- () countersign orders legally drawn by the Secretary upon the Treasurer for money to be disbursed on behalf of the School District;
- cause an action to be prosecuted in the name of the District on the Treasurer's bond in case of a breach of a condition of the bond;
- perform other duties appropriate to the office of the President.

#### 0171.2 Vice-President

The Vice-President of the Board of Education shall:

- preside at meetings of the Board when the President is not able to attend;
- perform other duties appropriate to the office of Vice-President as the Board determines;
- in case of a vacancy in the office of President, succeed to the office of President for the balance of the unexpired term.

#### 0171.3 Secretary

The Secretary of the Board of Education shall:

- act as clerk at meetings of the Board;
- record and sign the minutes of meetings, orders, resolutions, and other proceedings of the Board in proper record books;
- () prepare the annual report of the District and other reports required by the State Board;
- () draw and sign orders upon the District Treasurer for money to be disbursed by the School District and each order shall be properly numbered and dated, shall specify the sources of the funds called for, the purpose for which, and the fund upon which the order is drawn;
- () preserve and file copies of reports, books, papers, and other documents belonging to the office of the secretary or to the School District, and deliver them to a successor in office;
- perform other duties required by law or by the Board.

#### 0171.4 Treasurer

The Treasurer of the Board of Education shall:

- have care and custody of all monies of the School District and the Treasurer shall deposit funds of the District with a bank or banking corporation or trust company designated by the Board in the proportion and manner directed by the Board;
- () keep proper books of account;
- keep an account of interest received from invested school funds, and credit interest received to the appropriate fund accounts;

- () pay out funds for the purposes specified by law, or, in the case of gifts or donations for the purposes for which the money is given or donated, on proper orders signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the President of the Board;
- perform other duties the Board may prescribe in its bylaws relating to the administration of School District funds.

#### 0172 Legal Counsel

The Board of Education may employ an attorney to represent the School District or Board in actions brought for or against the District and to render other legal services for the welfare of the School District.

#### 0173 Independent Auditor

The independent auditor shall:

- A. examine the balance sheet of the District at the close of its fiscal year and the related statements of transactions in the various funds for the fiscal year then ended;
- B. conduct such examination in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and to include such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as are necessary in the circumstances;
- C. render an opinion of the financial statements prepared at the close of the fiscal year;
- D. make such recommendations to the Board of Education concerning its accounting records, procedures, and related activities as may appear necessary or desirable;
- E. perform such other related services as may be requested by the Board.
