- PreK and K not mandatory
 - County does not process referrals over 16
 - YCS still process communication for these students

 - By intentionally speaking with and *not, to or for* our families we have definitely improved student attendance throughout the district.

EQUITY AND INCLUSION

Dorinda Carter Andrews, Ed.D. | Professor and Chairperson of Teacher Education | Michigan State University, facilitated a PowerPoint presentation on Effective School Board Operations: Courageous Conversations About Race, Schooling and Decision-Making. This session was about looking at who we are, and thinking about how to implement/approach this work with our students. Topics included: 1) The Big Picture | Who Am I? | Who Are Our Students? | Who Are We?; 2) Reflect and Share Activity; 3) Forced Choice Activity; 4) Race and Ethnicity; 5) What is Racism?; 6) Discrimination and Racism in Schools; 7) Forms and Types of Racism; 8) Examples in YCS, and; 9) From Awareness to Action: Taking a Race-Centered Approach.

Conversation on possible next steps/future workshops on equity and inclusion. Dialogue on defining the “whats”. For this year, what are the highest priorities? How can goals be made “actionable”? Hawkins opened up dialogue to the Board on suggestions of what they might like to see with this work:

Meadows: Equity

Champagne: Examining Discipline and Data

Sheler-Edwards: Achievement Gap

Ream Gainsley: Examine Programs and Data. An outside set of eyes may be helpful.

Hawkins: How do we have these conversations? Are we modeling tenants that should trickle down in the District?

Lee: Number of Student IEPs. Dr. Carter Andrews stated the Board does not deal with “school level”, offering suggestions of through specific staff professional development, personnel issues, etc.

Zachery-Ross: Attendance Concerns - How to deal with support?

Hawkins: Data for those with IEPs. Dr. Carter Andrews spoke of being a data driver, studying data and what to do about patterns in the data.

The Board recessed at 8:16 p.m. The meeting reconvened at 8:14 p.m.
