


# Enabling Restrictions on an iPad


Go into the Settings on the iPad




Under General:



Select Restrictions:



At the top of the page select "Enable Restrictions".



You will be prompted for a 4-digit Restrictions Passcode.




I suggest the classroom extension, it is easy to remember, but you are welcome to choose any 4-digit number you would like.



And you will need to Re-enter it.


You will notice that some of the settings are "ghosted" or "greyed" out.




You cannot make changes to these areas. These areas are already restricted in the available restrictions settings using our MDM.





**Please Note:**

YCS as a district has chosen to allow the use of YouTube. Many teachers use it to supplement their teaching.

The iPads are currently filtered using the same system as the classroom computers. Adult Content **is** filter by the district. Even though it is filtered, there are portions of YouTube that our filters are not able to block. In some areas the filters are not sufficient to block all images available in YouTube and similar sites. The use of YouTube in the classroom and on the iPads must be address through classroom management.



By selecting Limit Adult Content you can make more specific changes. You can add sites to the Always Allow or Never Allow sections by adding the URL in the space.

Because of district filtering, there are limits to the "Always Allow" capabilities.

**Please Note:**

Adult Content **is** filtered through the school's filtering system but remember, as stated above, there are portions of YouTube that our filters are not able to block.

You can also limit using Specific Websites Only:

**Note:** This requires more work and foresight to use.

If you choose this route, please be aware that some of the "apps" on the iPads are website links.

Symbaloo is an example of this. To use the Specific Websites Only section you must add the Symbaloo URL and all of the URLs Symbaloo links to, to the Allow list.

You can add websites to the Allow List by:

Manually inputting them under Add a Website...

On an iPad, Safari is the default browser. You can add websites to the Allow List by selecting Allow Website when you are using Safari.
