• Play: Students can play interactive games that hone early literacy and math skills.




• **Read**: Students can read animated e-books that introduce fundamental concepts while building language, critical thinking, and comprehension skills.

• Explore: Students can investigate biomes of the world.



Britannica School is built with young learners in mind. Students can read articles or biographies, analyze images, explore the animal kingdom, and tour the world using this resource.

- Articles, Images, & Videos: Students can read or look at a tons of categories of content.
- Biographies: Students can learn about interesting people from the past and present.



• **Animal Kingdom**: Students can investigate the wild, wide world of animals by reading about animal families, types of environments, and comparing animals.



• **Geography:** Students can explore a dynamic world or United Stated map. As they explore the maps, students can see the flag, articles, and profile for the chosen country. Students can also compare two countries. Lastly, in Geography Explorer, students play a game placing continents, oceans, mountain ranges, rivers, and iconic places to visit.

Tips:

- In the Browse By feature, several themes can be searched.
- If you type "TH" and a space in front of any theme titles (in the keyword search area), and click enter, then a list of the themes will come up that way as well.
- A new theme that has been added is Celebrating Identity (ages 0-8). Type "TH Celebrating Identity" into the keyword search of either resource to pull books that reflect this theme.



Animals: Students can explore numerous animals through reading, games, and a question of the day.



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
Social Studies: Students can explore social studies concepts through reading, games, and a question of the day.

World Book Early Learning is an early childhood resource. Students can easily navigate World Book Early Learning with its picture and text-to-speech features.

- Videos: Students can watch videos on a wide range of topics: animal houses, wild animals, creepy crawlies, sea creatures, my body, people at work, rainforest, dinosaurs, tough trucks, etc.
- **Games:** Students can play numerous versions of the following games: Concentration (at 3 levels), Tracing, True or False, Matching
- **Stories:** Students can explore reading passages on a wide range of topics: people at work, rain forest, dinosaurs, tough trucks, on the move, terrific trees, etc. The passages are leveled by Lexile level. Students can read the passage independently or have it read aloud to them. Stories also includes a series about Trek.



• Activities: Students can complete Print and Do, Paint by Number, and Coloring

World Book Kids features easy-to-read articles that can be read aloud or translated. It also includes engaging games, science projects, and activities. World Book Kids can be easily visually navigated.


Pictures and Videos: Students can explore topics through videos and pictures.

Maps and More: Students can analyze interactive maps and atlases.




Explora for Elementary Schools
